Spring Session of classes, for every age, from preschoolers to grandparents, is now open at the Torrance YWCA. Activities for boys and girls, men and women have been placed on the agenda.

Although special emphasis has been placed on physical fitness there are many self-improvement, informative and hobby classes offered.

For the pre-school boy and girl, there are classes in rhythm band, tumbling and crafts and an additional class for the girls in ballet and tap dance. All classes are one hour each for eight weeks.

For the elementary school girl, classes include ballet, tap and Polynesian dance and a feature of the spring program is a combination

drama and dance class for 8 to 11 year olds. This class will help the girls gain grace of movement, poise, develop creativity by learning to express themselves through drama and dance. It is held every Saturday morning from 10 to 12 noon.

For both boys and girls there are classes in magic, guitar, piano and Karate.
