

Poll Asks Opinions on Space Spending, Bombs

Six questions on issues of general public interest have been included in the current edition of Congressman Alphonzo Bell's "Capitol Report" to constituents.

Bell (R-Los Angeles) said constituents who do not receive a copy of his newsletter but wish to participate in the poll should write down their answers to the questions and mail them to his office.

Questions being asked in the current poll are:

- Do you believe Congress acted properly in excluding Adam Clayton Powell from membership?
- Do you support the argument that air strikes against North Vietnam should be discontinued?
- Do you endorse the Administration proposal for a 20 per cent increase in social security benefits?

• Do you believe sales of U. S. arms abroad should be more stringently controlled?

• Do you believe legislation for compulsory arbitration of labor disputes should now be enacted?

• Do you support continuation of the present level of space spending for post-Apollo projects?

Changes in Buying Can Save a Bundle

SACRAMENTO—How does the state cut the price of the typewriter ribbons it buys from 92 cents to 51 cents each?

"Very simply," said Stanley B. Fowler, assistant director of the department of general services. "You just buy the same type of ribbon with a different name."

The state uses a lot of ribbons, about 138,000 a year, to be exact, and will save some \$50,000 through this change in purchasing procedure.

This is part of a program announced by Andrew R. Lolli, director of general services, which will save the state \$12,359,000 over the next 12 months. Another \$46,040 will be saved by rewriting the

specifications for 4,000 tires—getting the same quality tire but at a lower price.

"This is only the beginning," Lolli said in a memo to Gordon D. Luce, administrator of the transportation agency. "You can expect more. Standards, of course, will not be lowered."

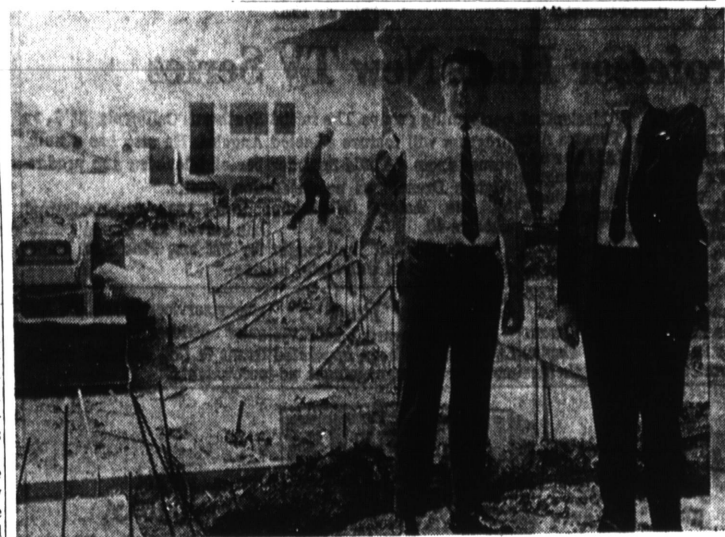
THE CHANGES in purchasing procedures—as in the case of typewriter ribbons and tires—will save a whopping total of \$9.8 million in a year.

Another \$1 million will be saved in use of facilities. Leasing will be centralized, salaries will be reduced through release of about 80 maintenance men, and lower rents will be paid. This will save about 1 cent per square foot or \$500,000 a year.

In state-owned space, there will be new space standards and advance planning to save \$250,000, and a reduction in alteration costs to save another \$250,000.

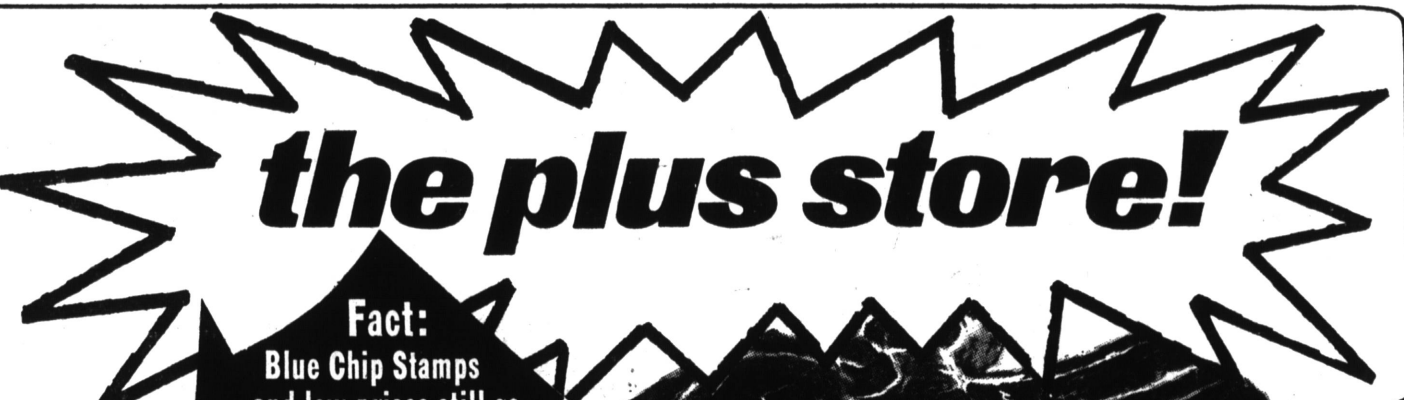
IN THE office of architecture and construction, stabilizing of the workload and not filling positions when employees leave will save \$535,000 for the next 12 months. Consolidation of the Los Angeles and Sacramento offices will save another \$319,000.

The department will save \$705,000 by adoption of new maintenance standards in the professional and vocational standards, public works, and motor vehicles buildings in Sacramento, the San Francisco state building and the Junipero Serra building in Los Angeles.
