

Montgomery Blanks Pair in Baseball

South, North Divide

South High traded baseball victories with North High during the week and thus failed to pick up ground on Redondo and Inglewood, also battling each other atop the Bay League heap.

Coach Jerry McIlvaine's Spartans pulled into a 3-way tie for first place Wednesday with a 9-5 win over host North, but in the rematch they fell to North, 4-3, at South on Thursday.

Redondo (6-2) is one game up on South (5-3) and Inglewood (5-3), coming back from a 3-0 shutout to Inglewood on Wednesday to blank the Sentinels Thursday, 2-0.

The only team to gain ground was Santa Monica which two-timed Mira Costa by identical 3-1 scores.

North, the defending champion, lost Catcher Mike Barnes and Rich Gonzales early in the campaign, and about the time Gonzales was ready to return, pitcher Rich Delany broke an ankle.

North's lack of pitching is mostly responsible for the team's 5-5 record, but Coach O'Brien found little wrong with Larry Wing's four-hitter against South Thursday. Wing also scored two runs, including the winning marker in the top of the seventh on Ken Stuler's second hit of the game.

Jeff Wang led off the bottom of the fifth with a home run for South. Coupled with an unearned run in the sixth, South tied the game at 3-3. The winning run in the seventh for North came off South's third pitcher, Charley Schindler.

Glen Thompson pitched 5-1/3 innings of South's 9-5 win Wednesday. The Spartans out hit North, 12-9, in the slugfest.

South travels to Mira Costa (3-7) Tuesday while Inglewood takes on Santa Monica (4-4).

North draws a bye this week. Coach O'Brien said he will spend the week rebuilding his pitching staff.

Redondo is host to Hawthorne on Tuesday.

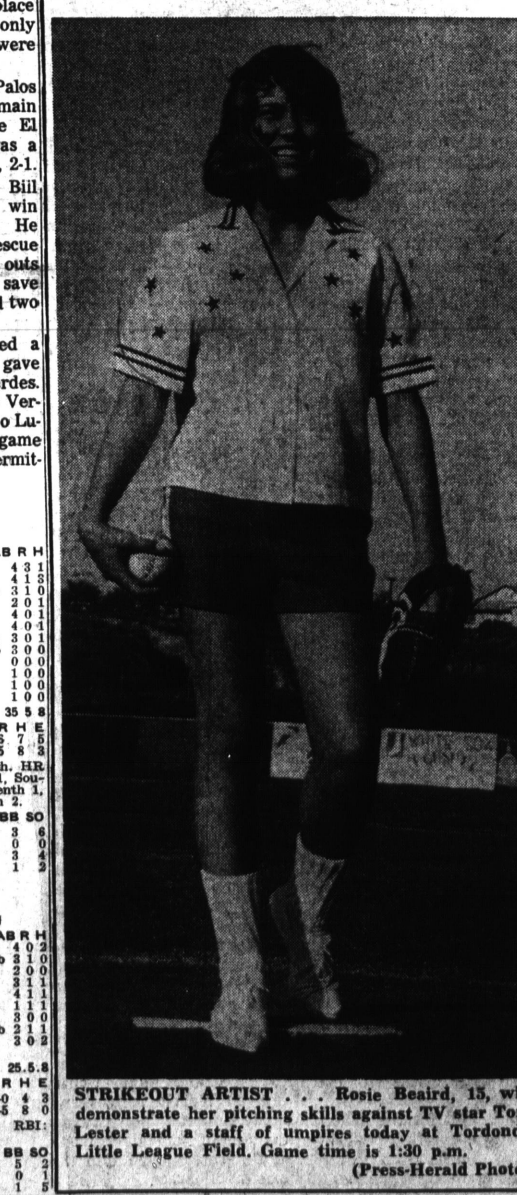

Mustang Rallye Set For Today

More than 100 Torrance area road-rallye enthusiasts are expected to participate in a salute to the third birthday of the Ford Mustang today.

They will drive 70 cars and log more than 7,000 miles in a special rallye staged by the Vel's Ford Mustang Club of Torrance.

The event is part of "Mustang Rallye Day, U.S.A." — the largest rallye program ever staged.

Nationally, about 25,000 cars will take to the highways and log more than 2,500,000 miles. In Southern California, 18 Mustang clubs are staging rallyes. About 3,000 people are expected to participate in 1,500 cars.

The Vel's Ford Mustang Club rallye is open to the public. Anyone interested in rallying may enter with any type of car.

Registration for the rallye will begin at 8 p.m. Sunday at the May Co., South Bay Center, parking lot. The rallye will start at 9 a.m. and cover more than 100 miles.

The National Council of Mustang Clubs — sponsor of "Mustang Rallye Day, U.S.A." — will make trophies available for presentation to the first and second place drivers and navigators.

Rallye participants also are eligible to participate in a nationwide drawing for a new 1967 Mustang fastback.

President of the Vel's Ford Mustang Club is Phil Knowles. Maxine Kennedy is rallye master.
