Baseball Rules Get Involved

A protested ball game has interrupted the Bay League baseball standings momentarily.

Redondo, and Santa Monica played to a 12-inning 0-0 tie Wednesday, but in the first inning Samohi was deprived a run on an appeal play.

With runners on first and third and one out, the runner on third tagged up and scored on a flyball to the outfield. The runner on first took off for second as the ball hit and failed to return to first base ahead of the relay.

On a double play involving this type of appeal play, a protest was raised by Coach Rube Navarro, claiming the runner from third scored before the appeal play was completed at first base, and the run should be al lowed.

Even if the protest is upheld, it must also be deter mined whether the game is continued from the point of the protest (first inning), or is the game awarded to the protesting team for scoring the run in the first Big Games inning!

Lasuen assured Bishop Mont gomery High School its first track and field championship

in the school's history. The Knights won their eighth straight dual-meet and third in Camino Real League competition.

The Camino Real League meet to qualify for the CIF prelims will be held Tuesday at Crespi, The finals are Fri-day night.
