A highway sign proved to be a costly target for two vandals whose shooting was observed by a California fish and game warden.

Warden William F. Hart, on extended patrol in Alpine County, apprehended two men as they shot a state highway sign at the junction of Highways 88 and 89 in Hope Valley.

Warden Hart took the men, ages 26 and 19, to justice court in Woodfords where they entered pleas of guilty to penal code charges of shooting from a highway and mutilating road signs by shooting.

The judge fined each man \$200 and further or-dered the ,22 caliber automatic rifles used in the shootings be forfeited.
