
Do you know what to do if you have a flat tire while driving on a freeway? "Don't just stop and change that tire," Captain P. J. Ford of the California Highway Pa-trol said today. "If you do, you may place yourself in great danger and may even cause other accidents. "The proper proceeding to

cause other accidents. "The proper procedure to follow is to move your car to a place of safety before stopping. This may mean ruining a tire, but it may also mean saving your life. "The shoulder of the free-way, if there is one, usually is a safe stopping place but

is a safe stopping place, but if there is no shoulder you should leave the freeway before stopping. It is highly dangerous to stop in the cen-ter divider strip because it is too close to the high speed lane for safety."

The Patrol commander noted that the same procedure applies in the event of an accident and the car is still capable of being driven. Leaving a car in the flow of traffic after an accident
