Dorothy Digs

If you have not already done so, you should give your lawn an application of fertilizer chelated iron, manganese and zinc, to green it up and provide it with the necessary minerals for this season.

Be sure to get one with a soil penetrant, as your lawn needs to be porous enough to absorb water, allowing the lawn to form deep roots. A shallow rooted lawn will not give you much satisfaction during the hot summer days.

The monthly use of an all fish fertilizer will supply your lawn with all the food necessary for the rest of the season. A normal monthly feeding is much better than a huge amount in the Spring and nothing the rest of the year.

I also sprinkle iron sulphate on my lawn each year in the Spring. This should be watered in, being careful not to let the water run on any concrete surfaces, as the iron in this compound will stain

concrete and stucco. Roses are now rewarding you for all the loving care you have given them. They will continue to do so for many months as long as you given them a little attention.

If you see any signs of bugs or mildew on your roses, there is a new systematic rose spray available this year containing Meta-Systox R, Karathane and DDT, which will quickly control the bugs and mildew. The systematic part of this spray will then enter the plant's system and pro-
