No date has been set for the wedding.

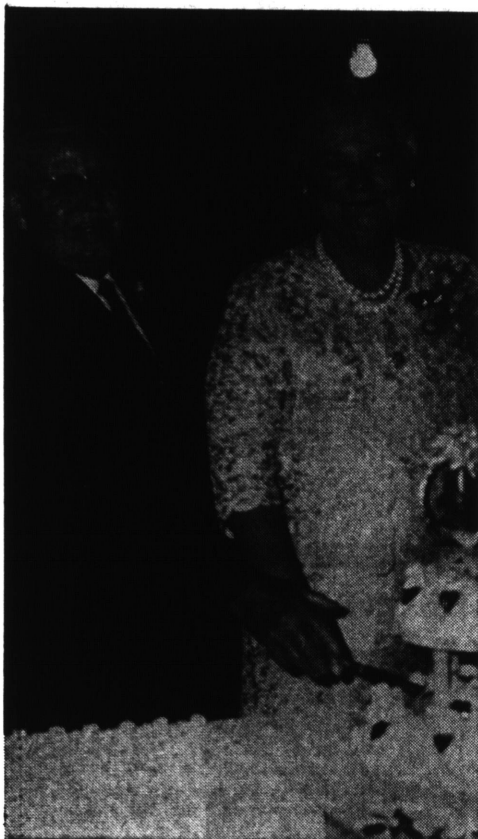
The future bride, who was presented at the Las Madrecitas Evergreen Ball in 1964, is a graduate of South High School. She also attended El Camino College.
