Dear Bruce,

In a few years, when you get old enough, I imagine we'll hear something like this from you: "Gee, Dad, why can't I go to Mexico? All the other guys are going."

Such cries grow particularly loud at Easter and during summer. Although those under 18 can't cross the border without written permission, many obtain it.

Having been in Mexico several times, including my first—and probably last— as a youth group leader, I'm leary of these teenage group excursions. The reason is that many teenagers go, they'll admit frankly, is to do things their parents wouldn't ap-

Reasons may be simply to go surfing or to see another country or to buy souvenirs, ranging from straw hats or transistors to dirty pictures and switchblade knives.

For some, the lure is alcohol, which is pretty generally available to people of any age. For others, it's a place to look for kicks they haven't tried.

Whether a teenager is looking for trouble when he goes south of the border, his chances of finding it are considerably higher than at home. Mexican law views things differently than ours. One youth group leader spent several days in jail because his charges bought some booze. A father had to pay \$10,000 to get his injured son back to the U.S. after a Mexican auto accident. Temptations are great, and consequences potentially disastrous.
