

Street Plans Approved

Plans for the construction of more than one-half mile of streets in the Carson area have been approved, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The streets, to cost approximately \$70,000, will be constructed by the developer under supervision of the County Road Department. They are in the Lomita Boulevard-Neptune Avenue area.

"The proposed streets will provide access to 103 new home sites in that area," Chace said. "The improvements include paving, curbs, gutters and sidewalks."

He said that approval of plans prior to construction by developers assures uniform roadways for present and future traffic needs.

Pharoah's Pacers Score Big in Safety Event

Study of Evangelism Scheduled

The Rev. Roy G. Sapp, pastor of First Assembly of God, Wilmington, has announced that his denomination has launched an "unprecedented study of evangelism and outreach to be unveiled in 1968."

The Rev. Mr. Sapp said the executive presbytery of the Assemblies of God has stipulated that "aggressive steps be taken to make an indepth evaluation of our strengths and weaknesses with the objective of fortifying ourselves to demonstrate a virile witness to our generation."

Included in the study will be the world missions outreach as well as all departmental programs of the denomination, especially as they relate to the growth pattern of the Assemblies of God, he said.

Results of the study will be the basis for formulating a Five-Year Program of Advance to be introduced to the 8,506 churches of the organization and launched simultaneously in the Assemblies of God Council on Evangelism scheduled in St. Louis, Mo., Aug. 26-29, 1968.

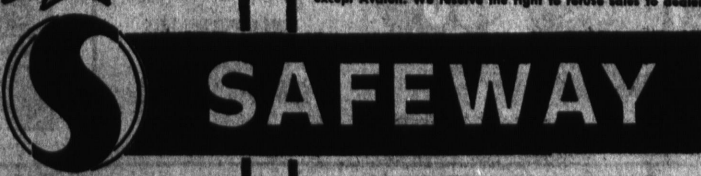
