HOLLYWOOD — "By now, Warren Report itself and in some instances a more thorough examination of the facts. It examined all the major questions raised by skeptics of the report and presented its findings in the medium most easily understood by most of the people: a four-hour telecast in prime time. Without a doubt this CBS report was seen and understood by many more Americans than ever read the Warren Report. Or ever will read it.

IN THE FIRST of the four historic telecasts CBS posed several questions, conducted its own exhaustive investigations, and gave its answers. New evidence was introduced and examined — such as the

theory of Dr. Louis Alvarez of the University of California who detected the blurs in the Zapruder film and interpreted them as evidence of the number of gunshots fired. In an impressive visual display, CBS lined up two men using the same sort of camera and fired shots from a distance and height equal to that of the book depository building. Their film blurred. Similar blurs in the Zapruder film indicated clearly to anchor-man Walter Cronkite that "There were indeed three shots fired as the commission said; that the one that apparently didn't hit anyone in the car was fired before the one that hit the President and not between the two shots that obviously hit him.

IN OTHER similar instances CBS news went into exhaustive detail from a fresh viewpoint and came up with the same conclusions as those of the Warren Commission but expressed them more precisely.

After controlled experiments with a Mannlicher-Carcano rifle, CBS significantly weakened a major contention of the critics, that Oswald was not the assassin because he did not have time to fire. These conclusions were reached by CBS.

Did Oswald own a rifle? He did. Did Oswald take a rifle to the Book Depository Building? He did. Where was Oswald when the shots were fired? In the building on the sixth floor. Was Oswald's rifle fired from the building? It was. How many shots were fired? Three. How fast could Oswald's rifle be fired? Fast enough. What was the time span of the shots? Seven or eight seconds. Did Lee Harvey Oswald shoot President Kennedy? He did.

THE SINGLE bullet theory was considered from all aspects including an interview with autopsy surgeon James Humes who broke a silence of 3½ years to substantiate his report that all shots struck from behind. CBS went into great detail to blast

the theory of a second gunman, a conspiracy involving the murdered officer, J. D. Tippit, or Jack Ruby, the sleazy night club owner, or anyone else.

CBS strongly censured the Secret Service, the CIA, and the FBI and the willingness with which the Warren Commission allowed them to investigate questions regarding their own actions. The possible link between Oswald and the FBI is still open and CBS called the commission's handling of the point "scarcely justifiable."

But as impressive as the CBS report was in substantiating the basic findings of the Warren Commission, it was even more impressive in its look at the American "conspiracy psychology" which is distorting public opinion today.

County Awards Drain Contract

Kral-Masonovich, a Baldwin Park joint venture, has been awarded a \$648,976 contract by county supervisors to build additional storm drain facilities in Torrance, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said today. Chace said the firms submitted a low bid which ran \$165,639 less than the engineer's estimate. The contract was awarded yesterday.

Due for construction are two projects with an over-all length of about four miles. Reinforced concrete box and pipe drainage conduits will be installed.

Work is expected to get under way within three weeks and will require approximately a year to complete, Chace said.

The project involve work in portions of Crenshaw Boulevard, Hawaii Avenue, Mariposa Street, Maple Avenue, El Dorado Street, Elm Avenue, Mariposa Street, and Garnet Street. Play Del Amo, Jefferson Street and various rights-of-way.

Funds to underwrite the projects were included in 1958 and 1964 bond issue programs, Chace said.
