

Guard Reorganization Plan Flayed by Solon

SACRAMENTO—Assemblyman George W. Milias, R-Gilroy, has characterized federal attempts to reorganize the army national guard as "sheer folly."

Milias, chairman of the Assembly Committee on State Personnel and Veterans Affairs, made the statement in a speech before the Northern California Civil Defense and Disaster Association in Richmond.

"In recent years," he said, "the national guard has been more active in law enforcement missions not incidental to combatting national disaster but in direct response to man-made disturbances."

MILIAS CALLED attention to the role of the guard in outbreaks of violence not only in California, but also in Ohio, Massachusetts, Florida, Alabama and New Jersey.

"Local police," he stated, "are no longer dealing with amateurs in riots and demonstrations in their cities."

"Hardcore agitators and demonstrators more skilled than some policemen are beginning to show up in areas that explode with violence."

Referendum Title Sought In Night Racing Battle

SACRAMENTO — Californians Against the Escalation of Gambling, the group opposed to a new law extending horse racing, has asked the attorney general for a title for referendum petitions but it's likely the whole matter will end up in court.

The assemblyman also suggested to the disaster officials that they use civil defense volunteers as little as possible. He said professionals must replace the volunteer wardens.

the first time, permits night horse racing. Just before its passage, an urgency clause was amended into the bill, which provided it took effect as soon as signed by the governor.

CAEG, headed by Thomas Gray of San Francisco, the Reverend Harvey N. Chinn, Sacramento, and Frederick C. Jones, Inglewood city councilman, has asked the attorney general's office for a title so it might circulate petitions to qualify a referendum for the 1968 election ballot to repeal

the new law. It would require 325,172 signatures of registered voters to qualify.

BUT A spokesman for the attorney general's office said not title for petitions will be issued. He referred to Article IV, Sec. 23 of the state constitution: "The referendum is the powers of the electors to approve or reject statutes or parts of statutes except urgency statutes."

The anti-gambling escalation group is prepared for such a turn-down.

"If the attorney general

should rule that he is precluded from granting a title and giving a summary to the referendum petition, because of an amendment declaring AB1082 to be an urgency statute, and, therefore, under the state constitution, not subject to referendum, we will immediately challenge the constitutionality of the amendment declaring AB1082 to be an urgency statute before the state supreme court," Gray said.

"THE STATE constitution clearly defines urgency sta-

tes as 'those necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety,'" he said. "We believe no rational person can hold that the extension of pari-mutuel betting on daytime horse racing and the removal of the long-standing prohibition against pari-mutuel betting on night horse racing, as provided for by AB1082, are necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety."

Before signing the bill into law, Governor Reagan said

he would have preferred the bill did not include night racing nor the urgency clause.
