LISTEN FOR SIGNALS

After placing a call, listen for the ringing signal, busy signal, or report from the operator. Please do not abandon the call until the called party has had a reasonable time to answer. The ringing signal is "burring" tone. The busy signal is a continuously pulsating "buzzing" tone. When you hear the busy signal, please replace the receiver and call later.

ANSWERING CALLS

When answering calls, time will be saved if you give your own number or name.

PUBLIC TELEPHONES

Instructions regarding the use of Public Telephones are posted on or near the telephone instrument.

No charge will be made on a local call which is not completed, or on a call for a number which has been changed, unless a connection is established to the new number.
