TO DIAL A NUMBER

Be sure the number is correct and that it may be dialed direct from your telephone.

Listen for the dial tone.

Dial the first two letters (black on the dial) then the numerals (red on the dial).

Remove finger and let dial return freely after each letter and numeral dialed.

If a mistake has been made in dialing, hang up and dial the letters and numerals again.

You cannot reach a party on your line by dialing. To ascertain the number of a party on your line, ask Repair Service, 114, for the number. To call a party on your line, dial operator and tell her the number you wish to call is on your line and she will assist you.

TONES AND SIGNALS

DIAL TONE-A continuous hum-the signal to start dialing. Listen for it before dialing.

RINGING SIGNAL—A burring tone repeated at regular intervals.

BUSY TONE-A steady buzz-buzz tone.

MIS-ROUTED CALL TONE-A tone rising and falling in pitch, indicating an office name or a series of numbers not accessible by direct dialing from your telephone.
