duce Mon, in Close Touch with Conditions, Declare That the Orchards and Gardens of Southern California Will Surpass Themselves —Early Fruit and Vegetable Shipments Already Made.

Southern California stands on the threshold of one of the most profitable and prolific agricultural and horticultural epochs of its history. To estimate the millions that will come from the soil is a task that not an expert in any line of the industry of fruit or vegetable production, packing or shipping, will venture.

The contribution to the food supply will not only be local, but will be world-wide. Our markets are continually expanding and increasing and this section of the country stands in the front rank of exporters of prodducts of the soil. Orders for Southern California dried fruits, for 1914 delivery, are already coming from China, from England, from Australia and from other parts of the world.

CALIFORNIA THIRD IN NEW STEAM ROAD MILEAGE

But two states lead California in 1913 in the construction of new steam line mileage, according to official figures, issued by the Railway Gazette. They were Montana and Texas, with, respectively, 377 and 367 miles of new track, as compared with the construction of 230 additional miles of track in this state during the year. In Arizona the new construction amounted to 113 miles. and in Nevada to 98 miles.

In detail, the new construction in he state showed the usual consistent gains by the south half of the state, with a total of sixty miles of new first track an dtwenty-five miles of cond track.

EDISON COMPANY WILL REDUCE LIGHTING RATES

The Southern California Edisor Company has filed with the State Railroad Commission a revised schedule reducing rates in practically all of Southern California. It provides a naximum lighting rate of seven cents per kilowatt hour. The new rate is effective March 1st of the present

It is estimated that the reduction will save consumers \$200,000 annually. It will be felt chiefly in Los Angeles, Riverside, Orange and San Berhardino counties. It is to be applied o every community served except where rates are already fixed by city ordinance.
