ANNUAL MEETING FARM BUREAU DECEMBER 4

Baldwin Ranch, Arcadia
The annual meeting of the Los An-County Farm Bureau will be held Saturday, Dec. 4, at the famous Baldwin Ranch at Arcadia. Through the courtesy of Mrs. Anita Baldwin Farm Bureau is enabled to use this ranch again as the place to dis-annual meeting. The annual meet-ings of the various departments of the Farm Bureau, including the Dairymen, the Potato Growers, and the Home Department members, have been scheduled for 9:45. At these meetings reports on the work during the past year will be rendered and plans outlined for the coming year's work.
The annual meeting of the Farm Bu-reau itself is scheduled for 10:45, at which time reports on the work of the organization will be rendered and election of officers for the coming year will be held. At 12:30 there will be a basket luncheon, with coff served by the Farm Bureau, following which a splendid speaking program will be provided. President J. B. Vaile, who has just completed a two months trip throughout the East studying reim-Bureau work over the country at large, investigating particularly the work of the American Farm Bureau Federation, will deliver a report on his trip. Prof. B. H. Crocheron, Director of Agricultural Exten-sion at the State College of Agriculsion at the State College of Agricul-ture, and State leader of farm advis-ors, will make the address of the att-ernoon. Following the speaking pro-gram characteristic demonstrations of Farm Bureau and agricultural extension service activities during this past year will be conducted, including woork with livestock, in the form of milk testing and dairy cow judging. Awarding of medals in the dairy cow competition will be a part of the program. Work with the decideous fruit growers will be exemplified and inspection of a demonstration plot where three systems of pruning were used this past year. Records of the yields will be available. Farm Bureau members are expected to sura out in force at this meeting. Vigitors are cordially welcome. The committee in charge of the annual meeting consists of S. Erle Goodall, chairman, and Ed Hall, H. S. Bissell, L. B. Doan and Wm. R. Harriman.
