A complete program for the meeting calls for reports of committees on highways, parks, sanitation, flood control and other topics in which the various communities are interested...

At the morning session brief ad-dresses will be made by John McWilliams, Jr., president of the Pasadena Chamber of Commerce; Hiram W Wadsworth , chairman of the Board of Directors of the City of Pasadena and R. F. McClellan, chairman of the Board of Supervisors. "Where Shall We Get the Money," will be the topic

of a round table discussion at the noon luncheon. Plan and Purpose

In a statement of the purposes of the organization, Chairman McClellan says:

"The process through which this tremendous community is developing is through the combined growth of the many cities and county territory within its confines. Each municipality is rapidly expanding from year to year and spreading its limits closer and closer to its neighboring communities. In this respect the process resembles the spreading of a spot of ink on bloting paper.

PROGRAM TO INCREASE TAXES

A move is on in this state to inaugurate the most gigantic public ownership campaign ever undertaken in the West. The proposal is a constitutional amendment to authorize the state to expend \$500,000,000 on hydroelectric and irrigation schemes. Already a state campaign committee has opened headquarters at 905 First National Bank Bldg., San Francisco. Other offices will be opened in Los Angeles, Sacramento and Riverside and an aggressive campaign will be started to put the new water measure on the ballot at the General Election of November, 1922.

The measure is fathered principally, it is alleged, persons now holding public office. There has been no demand and so far as known not even a request from a disinterested private citizen or the public at large that the state enter into any such a risky and costly undertak-

The people will be asked to vote on a political proping osition, fathered by politicians but paid for by the people The expenditure of \$500,000,000 in developing state power and irrigation projects would mean the addition of a tremendous overhead in the state government with resulting increases in taxation.

The whole proposition will be heralded and advertised as a great move to protect the rights of the people. Their votes will be solicited on this basis. The flag will be waved and corporations will be attacked, but not one word will be mentioned about the cost to the people. The cry will be raised that this measure must be voted to break the grip of the power companies in California break the grip of the power companies in Canfornia. The whole show will be carried on in the name of the dear people and for their benefit, but after it is all over, if the measure is bassed, they will find ourselves faced with a \$500,000,000 mortgage on the state. The chaim is not even made that the present power development of California is failing to supply the needs of the people. Private companies already have plans on foot for expen-Private companies already have plans on foot for expenditure of upwards of \$1,000,000,000 for increased hydroelectric development during the next ten years. private companies are under the strict regulation of both Federal and state government. Issuance of their secur-ities including stocks and bonds is under state regulation. The state has supervision over their rates, character of service, etc. If the state owned all the existing plants it could scarcely have greater control over their operations than it does at the present time.

Under the present system of private ownership the taxpayer is not liable for losses, management is much more efficient than could possibly be secured under public ownership, due to the element of competition, and incidentally under private ownership the state secures a great portion of its revenue from the taxes paid by public utilities

While this campaign for public ownership is on, the investing public will look with disfavor on the state of California for when the state goes into business the private investor in all lines suffers, if for no other reason than that state taxes increase.

The present move is a clear case of political propotion to inaugurate gigantic state undertakings for polit-

ical purposes. Apparently there is a well financed or-ganization ready to put this proposition over on the peo-There is no need of state ownership of this characple. ter under our present laws protecting the public, and there is every reason for defeating such a movement at this time when the burden of taxation must be held down instead of increased.
