AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELEC-GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS, AND FOR ESTABLISH-ING VOTING PRECINCTS AND POLITING PLACES, APPOINT-ING ELECTION OFFICERS, AND Three will be one voting precinct. FOR GIVING NOTICE OF ELEC-TION OF EACH SUCH ELEC-

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, California, do ordain as follows:

A general municipal election shall be held in said City of Torrance on the second Monday in April in each even numbered year.

Section 2. Not earlier than the sixteenth day and not later than the estate office on the northeast corner twentieth day before each such election ,the Board of Trustees of said City of Torrance shall, by resolution:

(a) State the time of the election nd what offices are to be filled thereat (specifying short terms, if any

(b) Establish voting precincts in said City of Torrance for the election by consolidating two or more of the regular election precincts established in said city for the last preceding state or county election.

(c) Appoint one inspector, two judges and two clerks as election officers to have charge of the election in each such voting precinct, and fix their compensation.

(d) Locate the polling place in each such voting precinct; and

(e) Direct the City Clerk of said City of Torrance to publish once dura newspaper of general circulation printed, published and circulated in City Clerk; and a City Treasurer. said city, to be named in such reso lution, a notice of such election, en-"Notice of Election," which notice shall contain a statement of the time of election, the offices to be filled thereat (specifying short terms, if any there be), propositions to be voted on, if any, and briefly, a general description of the voting pre-cincts and locations of the polling places, which notice of election shall be in the form and contain the substance as now or shall hereafter be provided by law for giving notice of such elections in cities of the sixth class, and, in addition thereto and in shall publish the names of election officers and the offices to be filled by such election officers in each of such voting precincts.

Section 3. In all other respects, not provided for herein, such general municipal elections shall be held and conducted in accordance with the election laws of the State of California so far as the same may be applicable, and such election laws so applicable, are hereby adopted as portions of this ordinance.


