used as a kitchen, while a room DISTILLERY FOR GASOLINE AND OIL MAY COME HERE

The possibility of securing another great industry for Torrance is announced and made possible by the invention of a shale-oil distilling process which separates petroleum oil from shale and also makes possible the recovery of gasoline at a total cost of 30 to 50 cents per barrel. The Standard Oil Company owns a patent on a process, this newer invention, by E. Hartmon of Oakland, makes a wider field for shale distillation. The Devon Oil Shale Company of Cin cinnati has a plant with a capacity of 250 tons at Clay City, Ky., and a 500 ton capacity plant at Lamar Mo. It is said that one ton of oil shale will yield one barrel of oil, and that a plant of 250 tons capacity as likely to be built in Torcost \$40,000, and will rance these figures would be very profit able

A model of this Hartman oil still is on exhibition in the rear of the Hellman Bank Bldg., Los Angeles, where the process may be more readily understood upon examina-tion. In the event of the establishment of a treatment plant, ,the shale would be shipped in from many points deemed too inaccessible or unprofitable for various reasons Torrance being considered the more desirable locality, one of which rea-sons being its desirability as a central or virtually more central point commanding better shipping facilities for incoming raw materials than any other place under consideration.

OIL DEVELOPMENT NEWS-BIG DERRICKS GOING UP

The oil development work is progressing in a satisfactory manner and it is actual oil development the stage that counts and which gives assurance to all those who have invested in property in any part of the district tributary to this territory. Torrance Well No. 1 on Madrona street is now down to 1500 feet, with indications growing better every day. This well is between the Santa Fe, as locally des ignated, and Torrance. The Chansler-Canfield Midway has ordered two sets of drilling tools and equipment for immediate use on their nearby holdings and are going after the subterranean wealth in their usual vigorous manner, and they are fortified in their actions by their experts who have pronounced this as oil territory. The Standard lease of 36 acres on Madrona street is right in the development line; a roadway is being prepared for the heavy trucking of equipment and a tool house and other buildings are being erected and immediate pre parations also for building the der rick which will soon be in position Altogether the future is bright with the assurance of many wells coming into production sooner than the public may think, for these companies are engaged in development work and are not particularly interested in giving out any informa tion. But the actual and visible development as shown on the ground is a far better criterion than any amount of talk on paper. There is, therefore, abundant reason for an optimistic view of the early future

Give the vine plants plenty of air and sunshine, and water when needed, and they will give an excellent accounting of themselves on the wire.
