



### Section 1

Section 3 of an ordinance of the Cit." of Torrance entitled "An Or-dinance Providing for the Keeping and Running at Large of Certain Animals and Providing for a Dog License," is hereby amended to read as follows:

\$2.00 on each and every male dog and on each and every spayed female dog, and \$4.00 on each and every female dog not spayed, for the privilege of having and keeping such dog in the City rance is hereby required to be paid by the owner or person having custody or control of such dog, for each year, commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December next ensuing, payable in advance on the 1st days of January of each year.
