Reconnoissances were made for this feat of engineering last fail by Mr. E. R. Davis and the locating staff of the engineering corps. It was a perilous undertaking to lay out the first lines, and Mr. Davis and his men were obliged to creep along on the edge of a precipies of seven hundred feet, cling to vines and shrubs, as they crawled along. The next step in the process of their work was putting in the perunatic drills and cutting out a foothold in the rock for the heavy machinery. The trail once made between Powerhouse No. 3, giant steam shovels were brought into play and the work of widening the trail into an automobile road was rushed through with the speed which characterizes the work of the trained montaineers of the Edison construction force. As the work advanced more men were placed on the job and at the time of completion, acrew of five hundred men were engaged in surfacing and smoothing the road bed over which the big trucks began immediately to tray-cl.
