

SPANISH DEPARTMENT The growing interest in Spanish is shown in the large enrollment in the subject which is to be given a fea-ture of the State University South-ern Branch Summer Session. The close proximity to Mexico is said to be responsible for the city-wide in-terest in the subject. For the July session the Univer-sity makes an extraordinary cultural offering. Professor Marden, of Prin-ceton, is to give a graduate course in the Spanish Ballad, a course in Twentieth Century Literature, and a teachers' course. Prof. Jose Pijoan, of Toronto, is to conduct a course in Spanish life and art, as well as a class in advanced composition.
