#### STANDARD **OIL COMPANY** IN BIG DEAL

#### To Erect New Refinery Between Here and San Pedro

The Standard Oil Company's \$50,-000,000.00 refinery plant at El Segundo may be moved to the McDonald Ranch, between Lomita and San Pedro, it was learned Monday. Announcement of the possible transfer was made by Standard officials, it is stated, following negotiations for the purchase of several hundred acres of the McDonald Rancho, just west of Wilmington.

Contradictory reports received from unofficial sources declare that the Standard Company contemplates the erection of a huge tank farm for storing crude oil on the newlyacquired land.

That the Standard Oil Company

has been considering removal of the El Segundo plant for some time due to heavy evaporation and leakage of gasoline was learned from authorative sources at Wilmington last night. Crude oil is at present pip-ed to the El Segundo refinery from Signal Hill, Santa Fe Springs, Hunt-ington Beach and other nearby fields.

Coincident with the announce-ment of the Standard company's plans, it was learned that the Union Oil company proposes to enlarge its refinery on the Wilmington-San Pe-dro boulevard. Additional storage tanks and refinery units will be installed, it is stated.—L.B. Telegram.
