ORDINANCE NO. 27

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING OR-DINANCE NO. 6 ENTITLED * TORRANCE NEWS * ING THE STORING OF MER-CHANDISE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY, OILS, GASOLINE AND IN-FLAMABLE MATERIALS; AND Lake. REGULATING THE BURNING OF REFUSE WITHIN THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA."

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as fol-

SECTION 1

Ordinance No. 6 of the City of Torrance entitled "An ordinance regulating the storing of merchan-dise and personal property, oils gasoline and explosives and inflamable materials, and regulating the burning of refuse within the City of Torrance," is hereby amended by striking out Section No. 2 and substituting the following therefor:

SECTION 2

It shall be unlawful for any peron, firm or corporation to store any gasoline, distillate or other volatile or inflamable oils within Fire District No. 1, except as hereinafter provided, and only after obtaining a permit so to do from the Building Inspector, which permit shall describe the location of therefor.

The fees charged for said permits, for any location within the City of Torrance, shall be \$5.00 station, \$2.50 for storage for commercial or manufacturing uses, and misses the sunshine of Torrance, \$1.00 for private or individual use. as it has rained nearly all the

City of Torrance shall be not less than two (2) feet under ground, and the top thereof shall, in all cases, be under the lowest level any building to which it is connected, or of any building with in ten (10) feet thereof.

No such storage tanks shall be installed or maintained until a permit therefor has been obtained from the Building Inspector, who shall approve the location and plans for the same.

No gasoline filling station shall be permitted within the City of Torrance until an application therefor, together with the location and plans thereof, shall have been recommended by the Building In-spector to the Board of Trustees

and approved by said Board.

No gasoline shall be kept inside of any automobile or public filling station or public or private garage unless it be in a can painted red, containing five (5) gallons or less, unless it be in the tanks or reservoirs of motor vehicles stored in such garage, or unless it be in a portable filling tank or buggy containing fifty (50) gallons or less, approved by the Building In-

All gasoline shall be stored in a tank or tanks outside the walls of any building, and every such tank, or tanks, shall be thoroughly tested for leaks and coated with asphaltum, before being covered. Steel or galvanized iron used

A vent pipe of galvanized iron shall extend from each storage tank ap to the outside of the building to one (1) foot above the roof or fire wall. When several tanks are installed,

vents may be run to one main riser. The wiring of any electric light

connected with, or in close prox imity to any gasoline pump, shall be enclosed in approved metal conduits and all lamps used shall be enclosed in tight-fitting vaporproof globes.

SECTION 11

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Ordinance by majority vote of all the Trustees of the City of Torrance, and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in newspaper printed and published in said City of Torrance, and which is hereby designated for that pur-pose. And thereupon and thereafter this Ordance shall be in full force and effect.


