farmer endeavoring to eke out an
existence from his farm and barely
able to make a meager living up until last January, was worth about
\$50,000 at the time of his death, the
sudden wealth coming to him when
oil was discovered on his land in
January.

Riches coming to him after long years of toil had little effect on ride in a motor vehicle. On that farm and shortly before his death he had been engaged in hauling timbers to the Brock field.

Only once did he refusing offers of other automobilists refusing offers of other automobilists occasion an employe of an oil company offered to take him to his home from the city, Baptiste having walked to town. Enroute home an accident occurred and Baptiste was slightly hurt. He walked three miles home refusing offers of other automobilitss to give him a lift.
