

it was found necessary to secure but a fraction of this number" to bring the matter officially to the supervisors' attention. The tentative plan that we have in mind for the route to be followed by the bridge, the road to abut on Western Avenue, and one that is the Union Tool Company's propperfectly feasable, according to Engineer Jones and other experts, is a continuation of Western Avenue to Torrance, swinging into this city under the Pacific Electric bridge as at present, thence via Arlington Avenue to Narbonne Street in Lomita to Redondo Boulevard and thence to San Pedro by the present excellent highway.

"Regarding the objectionable, rough and tortuous strip of un paved highway between Electric Avenue and 193rd Street, it seems to be the consensus of opinion that as it is entirely out of the question to form an assessment district along the half mile, "the property being owned by five families of Japanese, and due to the fact that every property owner in Hollywood and of the towns along the Western avenue route "to the sea" would Lomita, to Redondo Boulevard and use this highway and be fenefitted thereby, the proper way of straightening an dimproving this strip would be to assess the cost insome way to the entire fourth district. Up to date I have heard of no objection to this method of procedure and as the estimated cost is only approximately \$20,000 it looks now as though the matter was settled and our troubles would soon be over.

"Some slight objection has been raised to the fact that the porposed route would bring too much traffic through Torrance. Such objection can easily be overcome in the estimation of many expert road builders and engineers by diverting some of this traffic across the Pa-cific Electric tracks parallel with erty on the east, and to leave the selection of the route from there to San Pedro in the hands of the Regional Planning conference.
