They re-elected two of the best supervisors the county could ever expect to have. And they showed unganny intelligence in voting on state and city proposais.

They passed the aften land law three to one, and in the next breath knocked out by one and a half to one the scheme to hamstring the initiative, they killed single tax three to one, showing their wise appraisal of the propaganda which linker, these two measures.

They gave chiropractic a big margin, and then showed they were not mere medical insurgents by upholding vivisection.

They adopted the school tax measures and the alien pool tax, but rejected the community property law and the project for a state constitutional convention.

They gave state aid to institutions overwhelmingly, but recorded a much smaller vote for exempting orphanages from taxation, a measure distinguishable from the other only by a shrewd and correct understanding of governmental theory.
