Tuna Loaf

Pepper Salad

Select bull-nose peppers, slice tops from stem ends, then remove seeds and membrane, pour on to shells boiling water and let stand few minutes, then drain and fill with salad of shredded cabbage, or chicken, shrimp or lobster, place on top of each a teaspoon mayonnaise, colored red with little fruit, coloring and stiffened, set each cup formed of lettuce; serve with lunch crackers.—Times Cook Book.

Carrot Marmalade
Four pounds of carrots, four pounds sugar, twelve lemons, one teaspoon of salt, fourteen pints water. Wash and grate the rinds of carrots and lemons and squeeze out the lemon juice. Add the salt and water and let stand for 24 hours. Then boil for two hours add the sugar and boil until it jellies,' usually taking one and a half hours.—Ladies' Home Journal

Suet Pudding
One cup suet, chopped fine; one cup New Orleans molasses; one-half cup brown sugar; milk; one cup raisins; two cups chopped apples; one and one-half teaspoons baking powder. Mix syrup and sugar; add suet, then half of the flour; then mix raising spices to taste, steam three hours, and serve with hot sauce .-- Mrs Martha Greever.

Walnut Wafers—Delicious Two eggs, beaten without separating; one cup brown sugar, seven tablespoons flour, one teaspoon baking powder, one cup of chopped walnuts, pinch of salt. Drop in pan a good distance apart and bake in a moderate oven.—Mrs. W. C.
