CHNIESE LABORERS TO CUBA

Eight hundred and ninety-nine chinese reached San Francisco Ocober 11th on the steamer Tiisdondari bound for the Cuban sugar lantations This is the largest number ever transported on steamer to America for such work. The southern Pacific took the men in three special trains to New Orleans and Key West. Thirty-one of the Chinese were ordered returned by medical authorities and four held for later action. Forty-nine guards accompanied the special trains to see that the laborers arrived safely at their destination.
