### TAXES-LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

All personal property tax and of realty tax become due on the third Monday in October

Fifteen per cent penalty is added hereto if unpaid on the first fonday in December. 1920, at o'clock P. M., and 5 per cent will added if unpaid April 25 1921, at 6 o'clock P. M.

The remaining one-half of realty tax is due on the second Monday n January, 1921.

Fifty cents for cost of advertising will be added to each item of tax remaining unpaid on the last Monday in April, 1921.

Both installments may be paid when first payment is made, if de-

personal taxes become due and payable on demand to the County Assessor on the first Monday in March of each

Taxes become a lien on all tax able property at noon on the first Monday in March of each year.

Taxes are levied on both real personal property as it exists on the first Monday in March. Sub-sequent removal or change of ownership does not relieve the lien against real estate of the tax on personal property and the Tax Col. lector cannot accept money for real property taxes unless the personal property tax indicated on the tax bill has been paid or is tendered.

Taxpayers must file statement with a County Assessor of all tax-able property, Real and Personal owned by them, in their possession or under their control on the First Monday in March of each year. This statement should be filed on that date or as soon thereafter as possible and before the last day of Church Officers and Veterans must file an affidavit in addition to the statement, at the same time or prior to July 1st of each year in order to avail themselves of the law giving them exemption from tax-

Exemptions-This exemption shall not apply to any person named hereing owning property to the value of \$5,000 or more. Property to the amount of \$1,000, of every resident in the control of \$1,000, or every resident in the control o resident in this state who has served in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Revenue Marine Service of the United States in time of war and received an honorable discharge therefrom, or the widow, widowed mother, pensioned widow, father and mother of such resident shall be exempt.

Tax bills will be mailed only to such taxpayers as have listed their properties with the county assessor for the current year's assessment in accordance with the second paragraph above

Should taxpayers not receive tax bills before October 31st, 1920, on any or all properties upon which desire to pay taxes, such bills must be obtained at the County Tax Collector's office in the usual way and taxpayers should not further delay procuring them.

No personal checks drawn on banks outside of Los Angeles County will be accepted for taxes. Postage stamps will not be accepted in ayment of taxes.

All remittances are at the risk

f the sender.

To avoid penalties all remittan es must be in the County Tax ollector's office before 6 o'clock P. on December 6th, and April 25th, 1921.

Road improvement and lighting district taxes, municipal improve-ment district taxes and irrigation district taxes are included in the tax bill when indicated by a rubber stamp.
