### APPEAL TO SUPERVISORS

A special meeting of the Business Men's Association last week resulted in the secretary of that organization typing letters to the board of supervisors relative to eliminating stagnant water in the vicinity of Weston and Narbonne streets, Lomita. It was recommended that the supervisors authorize the cutting down of the hump in the road from Weston street to Rose street on Narbonne avenue, to give the proper fall for water to drain. This action would necessitate the plowing up of the road bed and scrape the surface down, resurface same with a dip on either side of Narbonne avenue at Weston. This would mean a surface drainage, which, it was thought to be the only solution. It was further recommended that the board of supervisors investigate the condition of Narbonne avenue from the northern terminus to the Redondo-Wilmington boulevard, and resurface this pavement over that stretch with a two to four-inch asphalt concrete or Willite surface, in order to save the road, as in its present condition it is fast deteriorating. Attention was also called to the same condition that exists over the Redondo-Wilmington boulevard in Lomita, with the same recommendations for resurfacing.

Letters were also mailed to the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Rural Mails, asking for a better mail service. Recommendation was asked for a mail out of San Pedro both morning and evening via the Redondo-San Pedro stages. It was also cited that these stages run on an hourly schedule between Redondo and San Pedro with Lomita as a relay station and that stages were under the control of the Railroad Commission, and were giving excellent service. The bank, business houses, newspaper circulation and letter service is very poor. Only last week the local newspaper lost \$20 in advertising because of poor mail service. Copy for ads was mailed in plenty of time to reach Lomita on time for publication, but instead reached our office Saturday,—by special delivery—mind you. We might just as well have taken \$20 and thrown it in the ocean. Same thing.
