EXPLAINS CLOSING OF DEPOT

Chas. H. Mueller, Pacific Electric agent for Torrance, has taken up the matter of hours for opening and closing his depot with General Passenger Agent O. A. Smith of Los Angeles, after the "Enterprise" published complaints from patrons complaining to the having the waiting room locked up so early in the evening. Officials of the company state that keeping the office open for a longer period would mean added expense as some one would have to be in charge and the demand did not warrant this extra expense. It is impossible to leave the office open unattended, according to reports, as that was tried out when the office was kept open on Sundays for a time, and the litter left in the waiting room was worse than a "dumping" ground. People congregated there and ate their lunches, leaving all the debris on the floor and seats, it is said. It was this abuse of their privileges that necessitate closing when the regular force have completed their day's work in the office, and it is claimed that few people want the use of the waiting room after those hours. Every morning the office is open at 6:30 and not closed until 5:30 in the evening.
