### PRESIDENT HARDING'S INAUGURAL ADDRESS

President Harding's inaugural address pursues with singular exactitude the outlines of administrative purpose that had found their place in public expectation. His declarations in respect of economic and political questions square at almost every point with interpretations of his views recently made public.

"I speak," he says, "for administration efficiency, for lightened tax burdens, for sound commercial practices, for adequate credit facilities, for sympathetic concern for all agricultural problems, for the omission of unnecessary interference of government with business, for an end to government's experiment in business."

"If revolution insists upon overturning established order, let other peoples make the tragic experiment. There is no place for it in America." As to international relations the new president gives the world this pledge.

"If it will lighten the spirit and add to the resolution with which we take up the task, let me repeat for our nation, we shall give no people just cause to make war upon us. We hold no national prejudice, we entertain no spirit of revenge, we do not hate, we do not covet, we dream of no conquest, nor boast of armed prowess."

If again the safety of the world should be menaced by the spirit of aggression and conquest, again would America come to the rescue of the world. That is Harding's pledge, as witness this solemn declaration: "There was no American failure to resist the attempted revision of civilization, there will be no failure today or tomorrow."

Finally, the President said:

"We wish to promote understanding. We want to do our part in making offensive warfare so hateful that governments and peoples who resort to it must prove the righteousness of their cause or stand as outlaws before the bar of civilization."

"We are ready to associate ourselves with the nations of the world, great and small, for conference, for counsel, to seek the expressed views of world opinion, to recommend a way to approximate disarmament and relieve the crushing burdens of military and naval establishments. We elect to participate plans for mediation, conciliation, arbitration and would gladly join in that expressed conscience of progress which seeks to clarify and write the laws of international relationship, and establish a world court for the disposition of such justifiable questions as nations are agreed to submit thereto. In expressing aspirations, in seeking the practical plans, in translating practical plans, in translating humanity's new concept of righteousness, justice and this hatred of war into recommended action we are ready most heartily to unite, but every commitment must be made in the exercise of our national sovereignty."

This, in brief, is the substance of the President's inaugural.

### URGES SURPLUS MONEY BE BROUGHT FORTH FROM "SOCK"

In an address before the recent convention of the American Banker's association, Vice President Ellsworth of the Hibernia Bank and Trust Co., of New Orleans, declared that:

"The people of the United States are carrying around in their pockets or hiding at home \$3,000,000,000 of American currency, or nearly one-half the total supply."

"This sum, if available as a basis of credit, would enable the banks to take care of a very large portion of necessary business which is suffering for the lack of finances."

### CHINA FAMINE FUND

Five northern provinces, Chihli, Shensi, Shansi, Honan and Shantung, are all affected. The actual zone covers 100,000 square miles.

45,000,000 Chinese are directly affected; 15,000,000 are facing immediate starvation and will die without America's help.

The famine unless halted by American relief, means the break-up of civilization in North China and the complete collapse of a vast region, commercially, economically, and morally, which is certain to persist for a generation to come.
