"The China famine is the great-  
est natural misfortune in the his-  
tory of the world. Trained investi-  
gators, practical men, and a thor-  
oughly experienced woman, have in-  
vestigated and reported conditions.  
It developed that 15,000,000 were  
starving. No less than 45,000,000  
are seriously affected.

"Reports, fully authenticated, tell  
of whole families committing sui-  
cide, of whole provinces living on  
weeds, leaves, roots, bark and grass;  
children being drowned, girls being  
sold for \$2.00 each.

"Every report emphasizes the fact  
that the children suffer the most.

"Aside from death by actual star-  
vation, there are beginning dreadful

help a nation save itself; give that  
cholera and other frightful epidem-  
ics shall not spread.

neighbors; the welfare of each is  
linked with the welfare of all.

"Even from the hard-headed com-  
mercial view-point, our best posted  
business men, bankers, and states-  
men say the saving of the starving  
millions in China is a plain duty  
of America and the world.

"China's trade is important to  
the whole world as well as to her-  
self. She cannot remain long in  
her present condition without the  
nations, especially America, feeling  
the effects seriously."

## SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH HAS BEEN REWARDED

Ancient Bed of decomposed ma-  
rine shell lime has been revealed  
which is not only of great import-  
ance from a historical standpoint  
but is of tremendous value to the  
industrial activity of Los Angeles  
and vicinity.

Few people realize that lime is  
one of the most valuable of all pro-  
ducts contributing to the economic  
progress of the country.

Our Heavenly Father in His su-  
preme wisdom has placed this vast  
deposit of ancient marine shell lime  
at the very gates of the center of  
one of the greatest agricultural dis-  
tricts of the universe. Owing to its  
easy accessibility this rare deposit  
is fast becoming one of the out-  
party show places. Owing to the  
rarity of such a deposit and the  
fact that fossiliferous deposits of  
prehistoric life are occasionally  
found and are being assembled for  
sightseers visiting the property.

The Torrance Lime and Fertilizer  
Company's property consists of 30  
acres near Lomita or about five  
eighths of a mile south of the San  
Pedro Redondo Boulevard. A pay-  
ed highway leads directly to the  
premises.

The plant is electrically operated.  
Receiving its power from the Sou-  
thern California Edison Co. and is  
capable of loading 100 tons of 100  
mesh decomposed shell lime every  
eight hour shift.

The origin of this vast deposit of  
decomposed marine shell lime is due  
to an accumulation of organic re-  
mains or the collection of shell  
fragments and foraminiferal case-  
on the ocean bottom, resulting from  
a favorable prolific environment  
during the warm water marine per-  
iod. The accumulation was prob-  
ably in shallow estuaries or bays  
which at one time was bog lime  
and afterward pushed upward at  
the time of the break which caused  
the fault.

Bog lime is a soft calcareous mud  
and is known as coquina, being com-  
posed of loosely cemented shell  
fragments which contain some lit-  
toral sand and foraminiferal ooze.

This vast deposit of ancient ma-  
rine shell analyzes 96.39 pure in  
lime.

ness."

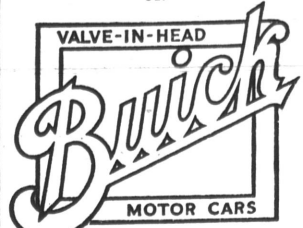
