NEW BUILDING WILL AFFORD HEADQUARTERS FOR CLUB AND SOCIETY GATHERINGS

An adjourned meeting of the local Post of the American Legion was held Thursday evening in their club rooms at the Post Office building.

The meeting was called to order at 8 o'clock by Commander Post. The minutes were read and approved, after which a report from the finance committee was heard.

A general discussion regarding the amount of finances on hand and methods of raising more funds was held, and it was decided to refer the matter back to the finance committee with the recommendation that a general canvass be made of Torrance instead of confining it to the merchants and manufacturers.

The matter of the contemplated building was next taken up and sketches which had been drawn by Comrades Sidebotham and Gallimore were presented. A general discussion of the sketches with regards to prices and size, as well as style, ensued. Estimates were furnished by the architects, which ran from two to three thousand dollars.

Motion was made that a building committee be appointed by the Commander, this committee to decide as to the style of building deemed most advisable and which would meet the requirements not only for dancing but sports as well. This committee was given full power to decide on the building and to then refer back to the Legion at its next meeting. Motion seconded and carried.

The Commander appointed Comrades Dejniger (chairman), Post, Long, Alken and Scott on this committee.

The meeting was then adjourned until Thursday evening, June 10.

The Legion Hall will be a compliment to the city if the citizens will get behind the boys and push. Push, shove or dig, but be sure you boost.

As is well known, Torrance has no place that can be used as a convention hall or meeting place that will accommodate such gatherings. The Legion boys—the boys who did it "Over There"—are going to do it for you, if you will give a little help, just as you gave the big help when they were away.

As has been stated previously, the Legion has purchased a lot, and starting with the members themselves, have created a building fund for the erection of a building. They next went to the merchants and manufacturers and called upon them for aid. The response was wonderful. Not one man that has been approached turned any of the committee down. At the last meeting which was held Thursday of last week a report of the finance committee was heard and no one could have been so surprised as the members themselves were. Six hundred and sixty dollars from the merchants and manufacturers, two hundred and twenty-five dollars from the members themselves. There's a total of eight hundred and eighty-five dollars.

It was thoroughly discussed and finally decided to make a general canvass of the city, reaching every one. To do this, slips were printed, which you are by now all familiar with, and also the envelopes. The slips have your name and the amount you wish to subscribe. The envelopes merely have the Legion seal and a few remarks. If you don't care to sign your name, put your donation in an envelope.

LEGION ROLLERS UNDER THEM

Ex-Servicemen Promptly Halt Exploitations of Pro-German Troublemakers.

In response to the warning issued by their national commander, F. W. Galbraith, Jr., American Legion members in many parts of the country have been active in fighting against efforts of pro-Germans and other hyphenated persons to drive a wedge between America and her allies in the World war.

Twenty-five thousand patriotic citizens of New York attended the "All American Meeting for God and Country," which was held in Madison Square Garden under the auspices of the Legion, as a protest against a previous pro-German meeting, said to be for the purpose of creating sentiment against the alleged "Horrors on the Rhine."

When word was received in Philadelphia that Dr. Edmund von Mach, notorious German propagandist, was planning to hold a meeting in that city, Legion members and other patriotic citizens opposed the proposition and succeeded in blocking the scheme.

Similar action was taken by the Legion and various societies in Indianapolis. Among the organizations co-operating with the Legion was the national executive committee of the American Gymnastic union, composed of a large membership of citizens of German extraction, which insisted upon unhyphenated citizenship, and scored Von Mach and George Sylvester Viereck. On the same day the Indianapolis board of public works announced it would not permit the use of its large convention hall for the proposed Von Mach meeting.

Learning that Louisville was on the proposed itinerary of Doctor Von Mach, the Kentucky department of the Legion instructed posts to use "every lawful means practicable to stop the threatened invasion of Boche propagandists." The Kentucky Legion's bulletin also warned against the activities of Viereck.

Legion posts have also opposed the hyphenates in Chicago, Cleveland, Omaha, Cincinnati and Milwaukee.

THREE VOICES AT ONE TIME

Minneapolis Legion Man Can Sing Tenor, Bass and Baritone Parts Simultaneously.

Wonder voices have been heralded the world over, at least since the inception of the press agent. But it was left for Joe Kaufman, a former army sergeant and an American Legion member in Minneapolis, Minn., to sing the first male trio simultaneously, carrying the parts alone with the same harmony and control of three singers.

Kaufman is a government music student.

The secret of Kaufman's unusual accomplishment has baffled voice experts as well as himself. Several years ago he discovered his ability to produce overtones which gave the sound of more than one part. He entered the MacPhail school at Minneapolis as a government student and as his voice strengthened and became "deeper," he developed the curious trick. The only case remotely similar to that of Kaufman, according to his instructor in the government school, is that of a woman singer in whose voice could be distinguished one separate overtone, over which she had practically no control. The former soldier in some way has separated and controlled tenor, bass and baritone parts simultaneously.


