CANNING PLANT IS NOW HANDLING TOMATOES

The sound of the whistle at the canning plant announced that the Harbor City Canning Company had resumed operations, and everything is going along nicely. Considerable new machinery has been installed, as well as a number of changes made, in order to increase the capacity of the plant. The changes also enables the company to handle a larger volume of business with a smaller working force. At the present time only a small crew is employed, but it will be increased as fast as needed, and many of the employees must become familiar with their own duties before they can instruct others.

The plant is now handling tomatoes, and it is estimated that this will cover a period of nearly three months. It is given out that the buyers are meeting with good success in securing tomatoes for the plant. The surplus crop of the San Pedro Hill Tomato Growers' Association has been contracted for, which will probably amount to between five and six hundred tons. Other big shipments will come from Santa Ana and the surrounding territory. Manager Misuraca is well pleased with the way things are starting off, and judging from the number of big orders that have already been booked it looks as though there would be a big demand for the products of the Harbor City plant.
