HINTS AND RECIPES.

How many cooks find it worth while to save a cupful of griddle cake bat-

ter? It is easier to throw it into the garbage can than to plan a way of using even one-half cup-ful. When eggs, milk and flour have been used in the preparation of cakes, even a little waste is an extravagance. Very nice muffins for tea or lunch may be made of the batter, add-

ing more milk, flour, baking powder or soda, and a half dozen fluffy light muffins will not be wasted for they may be warmed over for another meal and be almost as good as the fresh

A most delicious loaf or loaves of brown bread may be prepared from leftover griddle cake batter. Add an leftover griddle cake batter. Add an egg. more milk, sour or sweet, with soda and baking powder—a little of each is good; add molasses, a few raisins, two cupfuls of well-soaked stale bread and one cupful each of graham and corn meal; mix well, adding a little flour, if needed, to make a drop batter; put to steam in one-pound coffee cans tightly covered affecting the control of the control of the control of the can be determined to the can be pound coffee cans tightly covered aftor greating them well and filling two-thirds full. Steam two to three or five hours in a fireless cooker with water well up the sides of the cans. A hot stone placed in the cooker adds greatly to the heat, otherwise remove the kettle and boil again after it has been in for an hour or two. When the bread is steamed remove the covers and roll the cans into the oven to dry and finish cooking. A half-hour in moderate oven is time enough.

Coconut Meringues.—Beat the whites of two eggs very stiff; add slowly half a teaspoonful of sugar and continue beating until one-quarter of a cupful has been added. Now add one-half cupful of sugar, a few grains of salt, two teaspoonfuls of rice flour, mixed with one cupful of shredded coconut. Shape the mixture in rounds on a tin lined with light brown paper and bake in a slow oven until well browned.
