After execution is entered, then the cost begins to accumulate, as it is handled in the regular way.

All expense is eliminated. attorneys are allowed. No assign ment of bills is permtited, and there is no possible chance for collection agencies to infringe on the law and reap any benefits whatever from the new court. Of course, after judg ment is given, then it is up to the creditor to collect, and this part of the transaction may incur expense as heretofore.

Handling of small amounts this way is proving to be of great benefit to creditors, as before many small bills were let slide along, because it would take all the accoun was worth to collect it under the old system, and while it means a lot of work for the Justice of the Peace, it is a blessing for those who have numerous small account that are hard to collect.
