GOVERNOR JOINS FARM BUREAU



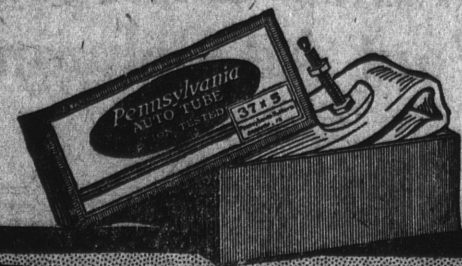
AUTOCASTER
