A MILLION IN CASH AND 1,000 ACRES FOR UNIVERSITY

Announcement was made recently that an offer of \$1,000,000 in cash and 1000 acres of the great Palos Verdes Rancho near Harbor City will be made to the regents of the University of California by E. G. Lewis of Atascadero, holder of options on the property from Frank Vanderlip and associates, present owner of the ranch. The proposed gift is for the purpose of creating here facilities for a greatly extended Southern Branch of the State University, and is to be made upon the completion of the underwriting of an extensive plan of Mr. Lewis for the development of the Palos Verdes as residence property.

The announcement was made by Prof. H. T. Cory, noted consulting engineer of San Francisco, who has just completed a survey of the Palos Verdes Rancho for Mr. Lewis. In his report on this survey Prof. Cory, in keeping with instructions from Mr. Lewis, submitted to the latter a detailed statement as to the desirability and feasibility of making such an important tender to the State university.

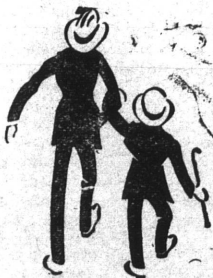
