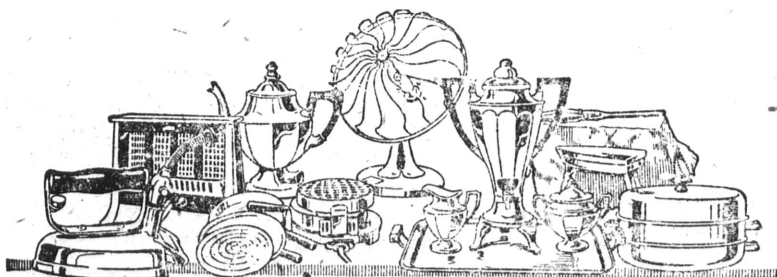

EDISON CO. SOCIAL CLUB

"Redondo being the birthplace of the Edison Clubs," said Mr. S. M. Kennedy, vice-president of the Southern California Edison Company, in addressing an enthusiastic meeting of the stockholders of the company held under the auspices of the Redondo Edison Social Club No. 1 at the Eagles' Hall December 7, "it is an unusual pleasure to come before you with my associates and to relate the story of our achievements and to tell you of our plans.

"With our Edison family grown to over two hundred thousand people, on the basis of only five people to each security holder, all of whom we serve with light, heat and power, and all of whom are directly owners and financial associates in our business, it is both enjoyable and mutually beneficial for us to take advantage of occasions like this to become better acquainted and discuss our methods, policies and plans."

The meeting was in the nature of a get-together between officers, stockholders and employees of the Redondo district, which includes the cities and towns of Redondo, El Segundo, Gardena, Hermosa Beach, Inglewood and Manhattan Beach. Mr. Kennedy was accompanied by Mr. A. N. Kemp, vice-president in charge of the finances; Mr. Benjamin F. Pearson, in charge of operation, and Mr. R. E. Smith, assistant to Mr. Kennedy, who gave a graphic illustration of the growth of the Edison system by the use of objects, marionettes and maps.

Mr. Kemp, in speaking of the financial activities of the company, made the announcement that the price of stock had been advanced two dollars and fifty cents per share, and that at this advanced price its yield to the investor is high, commensurate with the security, being at the rate of eight and three-tenths cents on the investment.

"The holder of Edison stock," said Mr. Kemp, vice-president in charge of finance, "is the most important man we have in financing.

MONTH'S TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS SHOW 1000 INCREASE

Two hundred of the 477 persons injured in traffic accidents in Los Angeles last month were pedestrians. The total number of smash-ups reported exceeds the November totals in 1920 by more than 1000. The number of fatalities in November has not yet been compiled, for five or six persons are still in danger of dying from their injuries.

The accidents last month reached the amazing total of 3093. In November, 1920, there were 2069 mishaps; in November, 1919, there were 1545, while in the previous year the same month showed only 998. The increase in four years is nearly 3.5 times, while the number of automobiles in use has little more than doubled.

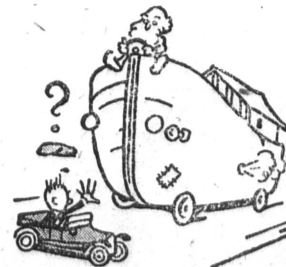
