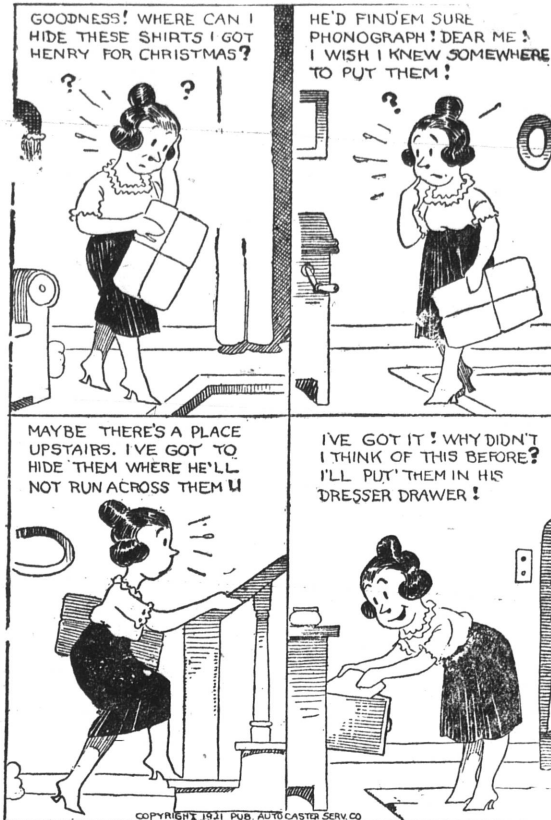

ed in the 1921 taxes. While the unexpended portion of the 1920-21 road fund is not forthcoming on account of litigation, it is believed that the road tax collected in this year's taxes and to be collected in April should be turned over to the municipality.

Report was made that interior changes and refinishing were to start in the building vacated by the post office, which would make very comfortable quarters for the council chamber separate from the Land Co. offices. An ordinance was read officially changing the meeting place. The chairman of streets and buildings committee was instructed to get figures on furniture for the new rooms.

The board regretted accepting the resignation of Marshal Olson, who is to accept a position in the Factory in Lovell, Wyoming. Members of the board expressed themselves as more than pleased with the marshal's conscientious work and added that Torrance had been exceptionally fortunate in its first employees in all departments, the work being marked by the highest loyalty and co-operation.

Mr. E. M. Anderson was appointed to the position of marshal and the police committee instructed to employ one of several applicants for night watchman.

Adjourned to regular meeting date, December 20, 1921.
