HERE IS DETAILED STATEMENT **OF STATE'S INCOME AND DEBTS**

WASHINGTON, Deč. 20.—The department of commerce makes the follow-manouncement of the principal financial statistics for the state of Cali-toria, the counties, and for all cities, towns and other subdivisions of that *EEVENUES*. The specified revenues include (1) general property taxes, (3) special taxes, *EEVENUES*. There was an average of 77 per cent for the civil divisions for which comparative data mere available.
