Daley's Success One of Romances Of the Southland

One of the outstanding business ro-mances of Southern California, an achievement of nine years, is the growth of the Daley's chain of retail grocery stores.

This month Daley's, Inc., now operating 120 stores all the way from Ventura to Tustin, will commemorate its ninth anniversary by moving into its new, modern warehouse, a part of the immense Los Angeles Union terminal, Los Angeles.

The remarkable progress of this company in the short space of ning years from one lone store, opened as an experiment, to the large number now in operation, while not without its struggles, is due primarily to the keen business foresight of one man—Joseph A. Daley, president of Daley's, Inc.

Daley's coming into the chain store field, after a number of years' experience as a newspaper reporter on the Los Angeles dailles, was the turning point in his career. Through the importunities of a friend who held some stock in the old Pacific Coast Mail Order House, Daley was asked to make an investigation into its conduct, with the result that he was eventually put in charge of the company as secretary and proceeded to adjust its muddled affairs.

The old mail order business was expitalized at \$1,000,000, and its activities up to that time consisted principally in selling stock to the farmers of Imperial Valley. The capitalization was reduced to \$150,000 the farmers were paid their rotes, and after the final adjustment; Daley iound himself with about \$50,000 actual cash in hand and a real desire to put the business on a solid foundation. The Federal Grocery company was incorporated at a capitalization of \$500,000 to operate retail grocery

stores, which were known as the Rock Bottom Stores.

The first store established became a success almost immediately and others were opened as rapidly as locations were obtained. In July of this year the name of the concern was changed to Daley's, Inc., and the name of the retail stores changed accordingly to Daley's Rock Bottom Stores. The capitalization of the concern at this time is \$3,000,000, consisting of a million shares of common stock and two million shares of \$ per cent cumulative preferred stock, of the par value of \$1 each.
