of the City of Torrance, California Declaring Its Intention to Order the Improvement of Portions of 222nd Street, Cabrillo Avenue, Plaza del Amo, Andreo Avenue and Gramercy Avenue; Declaring the Said Work or Improvement to Be of More Than Local or Ordinary Public Benefit and Describing the District to Be Benefited by Said Work or Improve-ment and to Pay the Costs and Expenses Thereof; Determining That Serial Bonds Be Issued to Represent Unpaid Assessments and Fixing the Time and Place for Hearing Objec-tions to the Said Work or Im-

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, California, pursuant to the provisions of the "Improvement Act of 1911" and the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915" and the amendments to said Acts, do resolve as follows:
