ORDINANCE No. 73

Calling a Special Election to Be Held in Said City on the 27th Day of November, 1928, and Providing for Submitting to the Qualified Voters of Said City the Proposition of Incurring Indebtedness for the Acquisition, Construction and Completion of Certain Municipal Improvements, Providing for the Issuance of Bonds Therefor, for the Levying of a Tax for the Payment of Said Bonds, Consolidating Election Precincts, Designating the Poling Places and Appointing Election Officers for Said Election.

Whereas, the board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, at a regular seeting held on the 18th day of Sepumber, 1923, by a vote of more than you high rate shall not be exceeded in the issuance for such purpose so submitted at the requisite.

That the public interest and neces-

Section 7

The City Clerk shall certify to the passing of this ordinance, by vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Trustees of said City, and shall cause the same to be published twice in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation printed, published and circulated in the said City of Torrance, which is hereby designated for said purpose; and no other notice of said election than the publication of this ordinance need be given.
