south of the road from the Superior Oil company's well George F. Getty has staked a location for a well on his one-acre lease. The property between the Getty well and the road is held by the Midway Northern Oil company. In order to protect it lease it will be necessary for this company to drill immediately between the two wells. The lease adjoining on the east is also held by the Midway Northern. It is opposite one of the new Chanslor Midway wells. This will call for an offset, and in turn will force the Hub into drilling on its lease, which adjoins that of the Midway Northern on the east.

Peterson, of the Peterson-Barker syndicate, is carrying the drilling still farther south and has put finaterial on the ground for a well on Acacia street, between Narbonne and Pennsylvania.

A mile east of the Midway Northern group, and just south of the Long Beach-Redondo boulevard (which is no longer a boulevard with a badly cut-up road traveled every minute of the day by oil trucks oil operators and sightseers), and a block east of Western avenue the Sentinel Oil company is preparing to drill on its big lease. Thir well is a quarter of a mile south of the Standard's Dominguez No. 1 which will be spudded in August 2. Going still farther east and a block north of Ocean avenue, in the Keystone district, the Shell Oil company has staked out the location for its first well on the east side of Torrance.

Seek Better Service

The question of improved water service has been discussed with no minor degree of vehemence during the past two weeks. Residents of Amopola street and vicinity have brought the matter of inadequate service to the attention of the trastees twice during the past two weeks. City Engineer Jessup, acting under instructions from the trustees, has consulted with water company officials in an endeavor to secure larger pipe lines to districts inadequately served.

But the company, as set forth by Mr. Osburn, is not financially able to make extended improvements.

Several directors at Tuesday's meeting declared the belief that adequate water service is of more importance to the city than street lights, and averred that if precedence were given to any bonding propositions and a fair price could be agreed upon, water bonds should be voted ahead of lighting bonds. William T. Klusman asserted that all of the proposed bonding authorizations would be more certain to carry at the polls if the city would first see to it that oil drilling is prohibited in the residence district.
