TRACTOR SHOW AT PAGEANT **OF PROGRESS**

Fordson Tractor Exhibit to be National In Scope

The Fordson Industrial Tractor

The Fordson Industrial Tractor Show which has been held in the principal cities of the United States since early in May, is scheduled to make its inital appearance on the Pacific Coast during the Pageant of Progress at Exposition Park, Los Angeles, August 26 to September 9, according to word just received by Schultz, Peckham & Schultz, local Ford, Fordson and Lincoln dealers.

"This exposition, which is educational in nature and devoted to demonstrating the industrial as well as the agricultural possibilities of the tractor in every day use, follows exactly the lines of the great exposition just closed in Chicago, where the Fordson Industrial Exhibit was the outstanding feature of the immense Pageant of Progress program, covering a period of two weeks," says Charles Schultz.

"Elaborate preparations have been made for the housing of this exhibit, which will include some 50 displays of industrial and agricultural uses of the Fordson tractor. An immense space has been reserved in Exposition Park, adjacent to the stadium, and two huge tents will be erected, one of

"The opening of the show in Los Angeles is the start of a series of the expositions which will cover San Francisco, Seattle, Dallas and Salt Lake City and which will continue until the middle of November. Included in the exhibits will be a Fordson tractor equipped with locomotive wheels, operating on railroad tracks, hauling loaded cars; a conveyor device mounted on a tractor, and utilized for loading and unloading gravel, sand and other heavy materials; hoists of all kinds; portable saws mounted

PALMER'S NEW **GAS STATION** OPEN SOON

Handsome Service Station to be Completed September 15

What is without doubt the handsomest and most convenient service station for autoists, is the new Palmer building on Border avenue, directly-opposite the Torrance Pasific Electric station and in the commercial circle that embraces the new Neill real estate office, the Dominguez Land commerce and the State Exchange bank. Constructed of cream-colored

Constructed of cream-colored brick and built in two sections with a wide passage way for cars between the two buildings, the station would be a credit to a city of several hundred thousand inhabitants. The portion of the structure that occupies the gore of the lot is to be used as the filling station, being equipped with the latest pumps and tanks such as are used by the Standard Oll Company.

Facing this on the rear of the lot is the Willard, battery service station, under the proprietoriship of H. L. Guttenfelder; an up-to-date wash and grease rack, a rest room, complete in its appointments; and an accessory and tire tube room, complete in its appointments; and an accessory and tire' tube agency as well as a vulcanising plant under the experienced management of Fred Palmer, who, with Mr. Guttenfelder, have for a long time occupied quarters in the Torrance Garage, directly opposite their new building.

Auto Dealer Points Out Danger of Crowded Speedways

The erratic "spurty" driver who passes you in a flash hasn't half the chance, according to the law of averages, it is claimed, of reaching his destination with the same amount of safety that the steady, consistent driver has.

So believes P. E. Hennis of Redondo, local dealer in Studebaker cars, Mr. Hennis says;

"When some persons are at the wheel of a powerful car they court death by "whipping" out of line every time there is a break in the flow of opposite moving traffic. In the course of a few miles they may have moved up fifteen or twenty cars and gained a possible half mile in the line, but to do this they have taken fifteen or twenty chances of a smash-up, not only of their own, but more often of the car they are passing.

"Aside from the danger to yourself and others, is the deteriorating effect this style of motoring has upon your car. Brakes that are constantly in use soon weal out. A motor that is subjected to unwarranted strain, produced by 'racing' in low and second, will
