In the development period of the country, Chambers of Commerce have had a varied experience and at different times have stood for different things.

The name "Chamber of Commerce" is really a misnomer. It seems that the very name mystifies people, that they think of it as some big organization that lives and functions automatically; that it exists in a community merely to do what they want done or else as something on which they may lay the blame for everything that goer wrong.
