Dan Morgan Smith, Command Col. Dan Morgan Smith, Command-er of the notod Battalion of Death during the World War, in a lecture last night at the American Legion hall in defense of the Wright law, The proposed Wright law, accord-ing to its able advocate, would make every peace offloer in every state eligible to arrest and prose-cute violators of the Eighteenth amendment. At present, the speak-er said, there were only twenty-eight officers and four judges in California, who had authority to either arrest or try these offend-ers.
